

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING CHAPTER 9 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, BY ADDING SECTION 9-1-6 ENTITLED "DOGS AT LARGE;" AND SETTING FORTH PROHIBITED ACTS BY THE OWNERS OF DOGS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

Chapter 9 of the code is hereby amended by adding Section 9-1-6 as follows:


Sec. 9-1-6 Dogs at Large

No person owning, keeping, possessing, harboring, or maintaining a dog shall allow said dog to be at large. A dog is not at large:

- A. If restrained by a leash, rope, chain, or other restraint of sufficient strength to control the action of the dog.
- B. If the dog is confined in a suitable enclosure.
- C. If the dog is engaged in obedience training, so long as the dog is actually enrolled in a dog obedience school approved by the city enforcement agent.
- D. While the dog is being used for hunting purposes.
- E. While the dog is being exhibited at an American Kennel Club approved dog show.

The term "at large" is defined as a dog on or off the premises of the owner and not under the control of the owner, or other person acting for the owner, and the dog is not confined in a suitable enclosure.


