

ORDINANCE NO. 112

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, PROVIDING FOR AND SETTING THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE YOUTH TASK FORCE COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF SAN LUIS: PROVIDING FOR AND THE ELECTION OF A CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN THEREOF; PRESCRIBING GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF SAID COMMISSION; AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF RULES OF PROCEDURE

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of San Luis, County of Yuma, State of Arizona, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Youth Task Force Commission of the City of San Luis is hereby established.

SECTION 2. A. The Youth Task Force Commission of the City of San Luis shall be composed of a total of eleven (11) members who may or may not be residents of the City of San Luis. The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Common Council of the City of San Luis. These appointments shall be for a period of two (2) years each with the terms of members so staggered that the terms of no more than six (6) members shall expire in any one year, and subject to the exception that in the event of death or resignation of a member the vacancy may be filled for the unexpired term. The initial term of appointments shall be as follows: Six (6) members with terms beginning from the date of their appointment and expiring December 31, 1994 (one [1] year); five (5) members with terms beginning from the date of their appointment and expiring December 31, 1995 (two [2] years). Thereafter all members shall be appointed for a full two (2) year term, except that in the event of death or resignation of a member, the vacancy may be filled for the unexpired term. The term of all members shall extend until their successors are qualified; provided however, three (3) successive unexcused or unexplained absences from any regular or special meetings shall be grounds for termination at the will and pleasure of the appointing authority without the necessity of a hearing or notice and such action shall be final.

B. All members shall serve without pay. However, members of said committee may be reimbursed for actual expenses incurred in connection with their duties upon authorization or ratification by the Committee and prior approval of such expenditures by the City Manager.

SECTION 3. The Commission shall elect a Chairman and Vice Chairman from among its own members, who shall serve for one (1) year and until their successors are elected and qualified. The chairman shall preside at all meetings and exercise all the usual rights, duties and prerogatives of the head of any similar organization. The Chairman shall have the power to administer oaths and to take evidence. The Vice Chairman shall perform the duties of the Chairman in the latter's absence or disability.

Vacancies created by any cause shall be filled for the unexpired term by a new election.

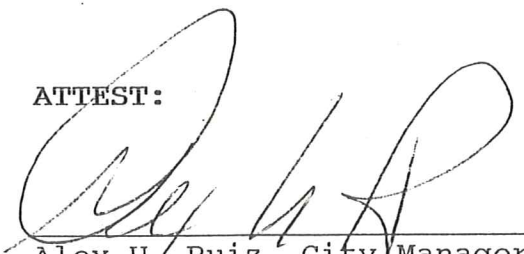
SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of said Commission to formulate , create and administer any lawful plan adopted by the governing body for the present and future youth of the City of San Luis. to promulgate rules of procedure and to supervise the enforcement of rules so promulgated by said Commission and approved by the governing body.

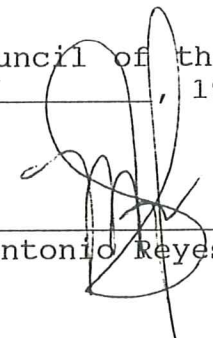
SECTION 5. The Commission shall provide in its rules for its meetings; provided however, that special meetings may be called by the Chairman or in his absence the Vice Chairman. In addition, any one (I) member of the Commission may make written request to the Chairman for a special meeting or an item for the agenda, and in the event that such meeting is not called or the item is not placed on the agenda, such member may call such special meeting or place an item on the agenda in such a manner and form as may be provided in the Commission rules.

SECTION 6. Six (6) members shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative vote of six (6) members shall be required for passage of any matter before the Commission. In this connection, the minutes of the meetings shall reflect the "ayes" and "nayes" cast on a particular measure and shall reflect the vote of each member present. A member may abstain from voting only upon a declaration that he or she has a conflict of interest, in which case such member shall take no part in the deliberations of the matter in question.

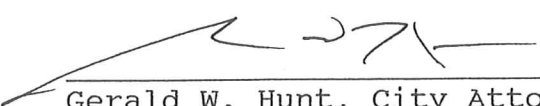
