ORDINANCE NO. 282

CITY OF SAN LUIS

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA PROVIDING FOR ANNUAL TRANSPORTATION BUSINESS VEHICLE PERMIT FEE FOR 2010; ESTABLISHING EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY

Whereas Section 10-5-6 (C) (1) of the City Code provides for an annual Transportation Business Vehicle License Fee in the amount of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per vehicle; and

Whereas there is a desire to provide financial relief to Transportation Business Operators for 2010 who have otherwise complied with the City's regulations in good faith;

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona, as follows:


Section 1: That the amount of the annual Transportation Business Vehicle License Fee for calendar year 2010 shall be in the amount of \$150.00 per vehicle for those vehicles who otherwise were validly licensed and who had properly applied for or been issued permits on or before January 31, 2010. This change in amount of fee is retroactive to January 1, 2010. For all other vehicles the amount of fee is to remain at Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per vehicle. The amount of annual Transportation Business License Fee from and after January 31, 2010 shall revert to the amount of Three Hundred Dollars per vehicle as presently set forth in Section 10-5-6 (C) (1) of the City Code of the City of San Luis.

Section 2: City staff shall take such acts or actions as may be necessary to effectuate this ordinance, including but not limited to refunding monies to those who have paid more than has been required.

Section 3: In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Ordinance and any other ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are hereby repealed, superseded, and replaced, and the provisions of this ordinance shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.


