AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA AMENDING TITLE XIII OF THE CITY CODE BY ADDING CHAPTER 132 PUBLIC URINATION OR DEFECATION; PROVIDING FOR PENALTY; REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona as follows:

Section 1: That Title XIII, General Offenses, of the City Code is hereby amended to by adding Chapter 132, Public Urination or Defecation, to read as follows:

Section 132.01 Public Urination or Defecation Prohibited

It is unlawful for any person, except in an established lavatory or toilet, to urinate or defecate upon any public street, by-way, highway, or other roadway, alley, sidewalk, crosswalk, park or other public grounds or in any place which is visible or readily accessible from a public thoroughfare or public conveyance, or upon the floor or interior of any bus or other public conveyance, or in or on any public place or private property, or in a location that is or may be visible to other persons.

Section 132.99 Penalty

A violation of any provision of this chapter is a class one misdemeanor, punishable pursuant to Section 10.99 of the City Code.

Section 2: In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this ordinance and any other ordinance, resolution, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are hereby repealed, superseded, and replaced, and the provisions of this ordinance shall govern.


