AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING THE SAN LUIS CITY CODE § 2.05.460 TO ALIGN THE CITY COUNCIL MINUTES REQUIREMENT WITH CURRENT STATE LAW A.R.S. § 38-431.01(C)(4); REPEALING ANY CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, the city desires to amend San Luis City Code § 2.05.460 so it aligns with the requirements under A.R.S. § 38-431.01(C)(4) of the Open Meeting Law that “an accurate description of all legal actions proposed, discussed or taken, including a record of how each member voted; and

WHEREAS, the city codifies the long-standing practice of counting those Council Members who are present but silent during the time for a vote as a vote in favor of the question, also known as the motion;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona:

Section 1: Section 2.05.460 of the San Luis City Code is amended and restated to read:

- (A) The Mayor shall vote as a member of the Council and shall be referred to in this Section 2.05.460 as a “member.”
- (B) The ayes and nays upon any questions shall be taken and entered in the minutes, including an accurate description of how each member voted.
- (C) A member who is present, and who responds to the call for the ayes and nays with silence shall be taken and entered in the minutes as aye, a favorable vote for the question.

Section 2: The City Council authorizes and directs the appropriate City officers and employees to perform all necessary or desirable acts to give effect to this Ordinance.

Section 3: If a conflict arises between the provisions of this ordinance and any resolution, other ordinance, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are amended, superseded, and replaced, and this Ordinance shall govern.


Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction or operation of law by legislation, such decision or law shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.


