AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, AMENDING AND RESTATING THE SAN LUIS CITY CODE SECTION 2.05.020, PROVIDING THAT THE CITY COUNCIL DESIGNATE A VICE MAYOR EVERY DECEMBER.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of San Luis, Arizona:

Section 1: Section 2.05.020 of the San Luis City Code is amended and restated to read:

2.05.020 Vice-Mayor (Designation and Duties).

(A) Annual Designation.

At the first Regular Council Meeting held in December each year, the City Council shall designate one of its members to serve as Vice-Mayor for a term that concludes the following December, when a new Vice-Mayor is designated. The Council is encouraged to rotate the designation among its members to provide as many Council Members as possible the opportunity to serve in this role.

(B) Alternate Designation Date.

If no Regular Meeting is held on the first scheduled date in December, the Council shall designate the Vice-Mayor at the next available Regular or Special Meeting following that date.

(C) Duties of the Vice-Mayor.


The Vice-Mayor shall perform the duties of the Mayor during the Mayor's absence or disability.

Section 2: The City Council authorizes and directs the appropriate City officers and employees to perform all necessary or desirable acts to give effect to this Ordinance."

Section 3: If a conflict arises between the provisions of this ordinance and any resolution, other ordinance, regulation, or policy of the City of San Luis, the conflicting provisions are amended, superseded, and replaced, and this Ordinance shall govern.

Section 4: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction or operation of law by legislation, such decision or law shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.


