

RESOLUTION NO. 109

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, COUNTY OF YUMA, ARIZONA AUTHORIZING THE HOLDING OF THE REGULAR (PRIMARY ELECTION ON MARCH 25, 1986, ESTABLISHING POLLING PLACES AND VOTING DISTRICTS: PROVIDING FOR THE RECORDATION OF THE ELECTOR'S CHOICE; APPOINTING ELECTION OFFICIALS AND FIXING THEIR COMPENSATION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is provided by law for the holding of a Primary Election; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has by proclamation called a Primary Election to be held on March 25, 1986.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of San Luis, as follows:

SECTION 1. DESIGNATING OF ELECTION DATE: That the Town Primary Election be held and conducted on Tuesday, March 25, 1986.

SECTION 2. POLLING PLACES AND VOTING DISTRICTS: The Polling Place shall be the Town Hall of San Luis, Arizona located at 23222 First Street. The Voting District shall be the incorporated area of the Town of San Luis, Arizona. The polls shall be open on said date of the San Luis Primary Election from 6:00 A.M. until 7:00 P.M.


SECTION 3: ELECTION OFFICIALS & THEIR COMPENSATION: A list of Election Officials will be submitted to the Town Council by the Town Manager to be duly appointed by the Town Council within a reasonable time period from the passage of this Resolution who will then conduct on said date the Primary Election. The compensation of each of the officers is fixed at the sum of \$3.75 per hour for the election; provided that a minimum of \$25.00 per day must be paid to each such officer. If any member should fail to appear and serve, the Town Manager shall appoint a qualified substitute.

RECORDATION OF THE ELECTOR'S CHOICE: Voting shall be by paper ballots. The Town Clerk is hereby authorize and directed to cause the printing of paper ballots as set forth in Title 16, Chapter 4, Article 5, Arizona Revised Statutes, and Title 16, Chapter 4, Article 6, Arizona Revised Statutes.

SECTION 5. DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

WHEREAS, the immediate operation of the provisions of this resolution is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Town of San Luis, an emergency is hereby declared to exist; and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, adoption and approval by the Mayor and Council of the Town of San Luis, and it is hereby exempt from the referendum provision on the Constitution and laws of the State of Arizona.
