

RESOLUTION NO. 144

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA PROVIDING NOTIFICATION TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF YUMA COUNTY OF THE TOWN'S INTENT TO BECOME PART OF THE COUNTY FREE LIBRARY DISTRICT PURSUANT TO ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES 11-903.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Yuma County elected, at its meeting of July 20, 1987 to establish a County Free Library District pursuant to the provisions of Arizona Revised Statutes 48-3901, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, state law provides, at A.R.S. 11-903, for cities to become part of said County Free Library District; and

WHEREAS, public library services are essential to the educational and cultural well-being of the community; and

WHEREAS, the existence of good quality library services is an asset to the community and contributes significantly to the economic growth and development of the community, as well as contributing to the quality of life; and


WHEREAS, the public library is unique in that it serves people of all ages and conditions from preschooler to senior citizen and functions as an all encompassing, nondiscriminatory, lifelong learning center;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town of San Luis as follows:


SECTION 1. That the Town of San Luis supports utilization of the County Library District created by the Yuma County Board of Supervisors to provide for good quality library services on a County-wide basis with equitable funding through use of a County-wide secondary property tax levy.

SECTION 2. That the Town of San Luis desires to be included in that District and directs that a copy of this Resolution be delivered to the Board of Supervisors of Yuma County as notice of the Town's intent pursuant to A.R.S. 11-903(a).


