

RESOLUTION NO. 227

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, COUNTY OF YUMA IDENTIFYING FY-1990-91 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING NEEDS AND ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN TO MEET SUCH NEEDS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS: Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, is amended, states that the primary objective of the Title and of the community development program of each grantee is the "development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low and moderate income..."; and

WHEREAS, Section 106 (d)(2)(D) requires the Governor of each state to certify that each unit of general local government to be distributed funds will identify its community development and housing needs, including the needs of low and moderate income persons, and the activities to be undertaken to meet such needs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and City Council of the City hereby state that the community development in housing needs of the City of San Luis including the needs of low and moderate income persons are in order of priorities:

1. Wastewater Plant Expansion
2. Ambulance
3. Park Improvements
4. House Rehabilitation
5. Fire Hydrants
6. Job Creation - Mini Mercado

AND BE FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council of the City of San Luis hereby state that the activity propose to be undertaken with FY-1990-91 CDBG funds to meet such needs are in order of priorities:

1. Wastewater Plant Expansion
2. Ambulance
3. Park Improvements
4. House Rehabilitation
5. Fire Hydrants
6. Job Creation - Mini Mercado
