A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN LUIS, ARIZONA, EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO THE REDUCTION OF THE UNITED STATES BORDER PATROL CANINE UNIT IN THE SAN LUIS BORDER CROSSING.

WHEREAS, the City of San Luis is desirous of pursuing the social and economic well-being of our present and future citizens; and


WHEREAS, one of the City's goals is to improve the quality of life for all citizens with regard to safety, health, and human services; and

WHEREAS, the United States Border Patrol has proposed reducing the "sniffer dog" program from six dogs to one dog for purposes of cost savings; and


WHEREAS, such dogs are important for the purpose of finding people and drugs; and, as such, their reduction will be counterproductive to the goals and mission of the City of San Luis as stated above.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of San Luis, AZ, that, for the foregoing reasons it opposes the reduction of the United States Border Patrol canine unit in the San Luis sector.
